EXHIBITION SPACES

Winter Palace of Peter I

32 Dvortsovava Embankment.

The Winter Palace of Peter I (architects Mattarnovi, Trezzini) was the Tsar's official residence from 1720 to 1727. The Hermitage Theatre was built on the site in the late 18th century. Today the surviving part of the palace is occupied by a commemorative exhibition dedicated to Peter I (the Great) and his age.

Menshikov Palace

15 University Embankment.

The Palace of Alexander Menshikov, first governor of St Petersburg, is one of very few surviving buildings from the age of Peter I. Standing on the embankment of Vasilievsky Island, it was built in 1710–1720 to a design by the architects Fontana and Schaedel. Today it is a branch of the State Hermitage Museum, housing the exhibition Russian Culture of the First Third of the 18th Century.

The Museum of the Imperial Porcelain Factory
151 Prospekt Obukhovskoy oborony

Founded in 1844, the Porcelain Museum was originally part of the Imperial Porcelain Factory. Since 2001 it has been a branch of the State Hermitage Museum. The collection consists of more than 30,000 items, both works produced at the Imperial Porcelain Factory and glass and porcelain from leading European and Russian manufactories of the 18th to 20th centuries.

'Staraya Derevnya'
State Hermitage Preservation and Storage Centre
37 Zausadebnaya Street.

This modern storage facility has been equipped to meet the very latest museum standards. Open to the public, it can be visited with a guided tour that introduces the extensive collection of furniture and carriages and other items that were for many years inaccessible to the public.
